



ONE of the most remarkable instances of the revival of what we might call religious interest has been the visit of an American evangelist known as Billy Graham, who has conducted a mission in London and for several nights had a congregation at Harin-gay of at least 1,200 people—and these came from

long distances.

The planning of the Mission was such that anyone attending could put his or her personal religious problems to a team of expert councillors and reports say that not less than 34,000 took advantage of the personal interviews.

All this is a remarkable testimony to the unexpressed religious hunger which is felt by a great number of people. There is, perhaps, no subject about which people are more reticent to speak about than the religious thoughts, but this Mission has revealed that vast numbers feel the desire for something which material things cannot provide.
