

THOUGHTS FROM THE VICARAGE

Writing these few thoughts on a gloriously sunny St Swithun's day, after a lovely wedding at St Laurence's, Affpuddle, the prospect of 40 days of rain seems very remote.

No one wants rain on their wedding day and understandably only our hard pressed farmers and horticulturalists and our ultra keen gardeners would prefer some precipitation to the wonderful sunshine we have been enjoying. It has certainly made for some good batting wickets.

In the midst of summer with holidays and a more relaxed feel to life in general, we are nevertheless unavoidably confronted with things we don't like. For example the tragedy of war and terrorism; how do we feel about the desperate situation in Israel and her neighbours Palestine and Lebanon? Israel has always made a very strong response to any threat to her sovereignty, in this case the kidnapping of an Israeli soldier by Hamas in Palestinian Gaza. The situation rapidly deteriorated when Hezbola, in Lebanon, took the opportunity to kidnap two more Israeli soldiers and thus the violence and retaliation has escalated, with many civilians killed and injured. It has exposed major differences amongst the G8 leaders, and will undoubtedly worsen prospects for peace in other parts of the Islamic world, including Iraq and Afghanistan where our own Forces are heavily committed and risks the further rise of militancy.

In the understanding of a 'Just War' which the major Christian Churches have

endorsed, and which go back to Thomas Aquinas in the 13th century, one of the prime considerations is that any force must be proportion and that civilians should not be killed or injured. Both these rules have been broken by all sides and all sides in the fighting have powerful supporters behind them, and some of them deny Israel's right to exist.

Thus we have the depressing and destructive cycle and spiral of terrorism.

We know that there are historical failings that have led to today's tragedy, but how can we stop it or help to stop it and how do we get all people to live in peace?

I think the key to it is to recognise that all people have a right to live in peace in an agreed land, without threat to their survival, whoever they may be. And with this paramount understanding to help all people settle, to build their houses, to raise their children, and educate them, to raise their crops; to enjoy health care, to trade and to travel and welcome visitors, to allow them to freely worship in their preferred religion and to respect all people different to themselves. A tall order but unless we recognise these simple but demanding priorities their will never be an abiding life that God wants for all people, whatever faith or race they may be.

I hope you enjoy your holidays if you are able to have one, but do find time to pray for peace.





AFFPUDDLE CHURCH NEWS

BAD LADS' ARMY

At short notice, the Parish Council was approached by an ITV production company who were filming episodes for the current series of Bad Lads' Army. The company was seeking work that the volunteer soldiers might undertake for the benefit of the community. First thoughts were that the soldiers should improve the gravel entrance to Bladen Valley and smarten up the surround to the memorial sculptured by Eric Gill. Unfortunately, the short notice precluded an opportunity for proper consultation and a plan of work in Bladen Valley, so St Laurence's Churchyard was selected instead. There, the soldiers scrubbed the stone and woodwork of the World War 2 Memorial Shrine in the Peace Garden and treated the woodwork with woodworm killer. Other soldiers levelled a grave and repositioned upright three old headstones which were in danger of breaking. A third group removed tree stumps and excess soil from beneath the west boundary wall.

On Sunday 18th June, at 9.00am promptly, and four weeks into their six week course based at Holton Heath, the squad of 20 soldiers dressed in 1950s uniform halted outside the church gate. There, they were drilled and briefed by an exceedingly smart sergeant who reminded them not to swear, not to smoke and to address the ladies as ma'am. These were young men all with a criminal record who set to at their tasks with a will and achieved magnificent results. Anyone wanting to be filmed had to be in 1950s attire and farmer Stafford Cox from Troytown who helped Roger Prideaux dispose of excess earth, entered into the spirit of the occasion by providing a 1930s tractor and trailer. Those at 11.00am Matins that day, who witnessed the soldiers' service in front of the Shrine or spoke to the soldiers, could not have failed to have been moved by what they saw and heard. It was indeed a memorable day.

It is likely that the episode filmed at Affpuddle Church will be shown on the ITV channel at 9.00pm on Tuesday 22nd August but you are advised to check the TV programme listings nearer the date.

PARISH COUNCIL

At the July meeting Councillors expressed their concerns about a number of tasks that the County Council seemed to be experiencing difficulties with completing. These included the clearing up of the streets after the re-surfacing work and the painting of the white lines at The Cross. Also they are very concerned about the 'safe route to school work' that has yet to be finalised, even though it has been going on for a long period. All of the points are being made to the County by letter with a hope that all of the works will be completed very soon. In addition it is hoped to raise these items at a Seminar that is, by co-incidence, being held very shortly.

As reported in last months notes, the Council is planning a 'Clear up Day'. Councillor Ian Ventham is organising this and an article detailing the arrangements appears in the magazine.

Councillors are also concerned that they have not yet been able to fulfil their promise of providing an 'all weather' surface in the Kick Wall area. The money has been earmarked and it should have been laid by now. We hope that this will be completed during the present dry spell and before the autumn wet weather – that normally comes.

The next meeting of the Council will be held on Thursday 10th August at 7.00pm in the Drax Hall. All Parishioners are most welcome to attend. The initial item on the agenda is the period for public participation, when any items that a parishioner is concerned about may be raised.




In July the group was leaderless due to Kath suffering the very uncomfortable pains of gall stones. By the time this is in print we hope that she has completely recovered.

To support the bid process the village hall committee has sought professional advice on the likely cost of the building work, fixtures and fittings. The remainder of the funding is expected to come from more than one source and the balance currently in hand can be used for matched funding. The advice from DCA is thus that the project is viable.

As already stated the hall is rapidly ageing and the existing facilities do not meet current legislation for disabled access. This project is therefore about reducing maintenance and running costs in the long term, providing disabled access and a wider range of community facilities than currently exist. Space is too limited here to describe what is proposed in detail so it is intended to stage a presentation in the village hall after the summer holiday period. Watch this space for further details.



Garden Waste

I have been asked to find out the "rules for the disposal of garden waste and this is what I have unearthed! The waste centre in Westminster Road, Wareham is run by Dorset County Council. It is intended for private use only. Their rules are very strict and DCC do not allow in business waste of any sort, or vans, or 2 axle trailers or trailers larger than 1.8 metres long and 1.2 metres wide. DCC will issue permits only to local residents wishing to dispose of genuine household waste where the sole means of transport is a private van. Even then they only let vans in if they have a permit for a private user. Application forms for permits (renewable annually) are issued by the Waste Management Team at Dorset County Council. Their telephone number is 01305 225002.

What this means is that people's garden waste (such as hedge clippings) can not be taken in by a regular jobbing gardener (who is deemed to be a business user) but can only be taken in by the house-holder themselves. This generally involves many more trips and is uneconomic in the use of time and fuel. I am attempting to persuade DCC to relax their overly bureaucratic regulations! I will keep you informed of progress – but do not hold your breath!

The Police

The current Inspector for the Purbeck area is retiring in October but what with holidays and other things she is more or less unavailable between now and then. I am arranging for myself and some members of the Parish Council to meet the new man (Inspector Ashley Adams) as soon as he is appointed in post. We will talk to him about the issues facing Bere Regis but as you may be aware the Police do not class Bere Regis as a "hot spot" which is where they allocate most of their resources. The important thing is that we establish a dialogue so that we can make the Police aware of issues as they arise in Bere Regis and Bloxworth.

Surgery

Surgeries are held on the first Saturday of every month. These are held at the communal Lounge in Turberville Court in Bere Regis from 09.30 a.m. to 10.00 a.m. and in the Bloxworth Village Club from 10.30 a.m. to 11.00 a.m. If you have any questions or queries related to the business of Purbeck District Council please come along. Committee notes

During June and July the village hall committee has been busy with preparations for the autumn and winter programme of events. These social events are important to the continued existence of the hall bringing vitality to the community as well as much needed finance to support the upkeep of the building.



The hall also plays host to the Pilates group, the Briantspuddle Singers, the Keep Fit group, the Women's group, Wildlife Group talks, Skittles teams, etc. and whilst these uses of the hall bring in valuable revenue on their own they do not meet the full upkeep cost of the halls aging infrastructure.



The latest issue that the committee has to deal with is the failure of the central heating boiler. Current building regulations mean that if the boiler has to be replaced the whole system will have to be upgraded, at a cost of £3000 plus. That is only one example of how the hall infrastructure is aging rapidly and how maintenance is a continuous programme that needs a constant feed of cash.

Thus revenue from the events, as detailed in the section that follows, is essential to the continued existence of the hall for the benefit of all. Therefore I encourage you to make a note of the dates in your diary and come along and enjoy some great entertainment and social events whilst supporting your village hall. Without your support this valuable community resource will ultimately disappear. It really is a case of "Use it or lose it".

The Repair Project

A further meeting has taken place with Dorset Community Action (DCA), this time with Liz Hole the funding advisor who has provided invaluable guidance on how to proceed with drawing up a successful bid to such organisations as the Big Lottery Fund.
